## **PART A - EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134**

### **1. BASIS OF PREPARATION**

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements, for the period ended 30 September 2019, have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

Lessor accounting remains similar to the current standard which continues to be classified as finance or operating lease.

#### **10. CHANGES IN COMPOSITION OF THE GROUP**

On 3 September 2019, PCCS Garments (Suzhou) Ltd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of PCCS, had entered into a Share Sale Agreement with Mr. Shi Xiaoqun for the acquisition of 51% of the equity interest of Shandong Yisite Garment Ltd with a registered capital of RMB5,000,000 for total consideration of RMB2,550,000.

#### **11. CAPITAL COMMITMENTS**

The capital commitments of the Group as at 30 September 2019 are RM7.8million for purchase of building, machinery, equipment and renovation.

#### **12. CHANGES IN CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS**

There were no other contingent liabilities or contingent assets, except for corporate guarantee amounting RM70 million given to licensed banks in respect of bank facilities granted to subsidiaries during the six months financial period ended 30 September 2019.

#### **13. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

On 18 October 2019, PCCS had entered into a Share Purchase Agreement with Mr. Huang Wei for the acquisition of 49% of the equity interest of Perfect Seamless Garments (Cambodia) Limited ("PSG") for a total cash consideration of USD300,000. At present, PCCS holds 51% of the equity interests in PSG. With the acquisition of shares, PSG becomes a 100% owned subsidiary of PCCS.

During the current quarter ended 30 September 2019, the Group recorded higher revenue of RM107.6 million as compared to RM84.4 million in the previous corresponding quarter. Whereas, the pre-tax profit of the Group for the quarter under review is higher at RM4.3 million, compared with the pre-tax profit of RM3.2 million in previous corresponding quarter. The higher revenue and profit were mainly due to the increase of turnover in Cambodia Apparel Segment.

On a year-to-year basis, the Group recorded higher revenue of RM221.9 million as compared to RM208.8 million achieved in the previous corresponding period as due to the increase of Cambodia Apparel turnover. The pre-tax profit of the Group for the period under review recorded at RM7.2 million as compared to pre-tax profit of RM11.8 million recorded for the corresponding period. The lower profits in current year was mainly due to higher other income in previous corresponding quarter which is due to one-off gain on sales of land and building amounted to RM4.5 million.

### 15. COMMENT ON MATERIAL CHANGE IN THE QUARTERLY RESULTS

Total revenue decreased from RM116.9 million recorded in the preceding quarter to RM107.6 million achieved in the current quarter. The pre-tax profit of the Group recorded at RM4.3 million as compared with a pre-tax profit of RM2.9 million recorded for the preceding quarter mainly due to the additional RM2.6 million provisions for doubtful debt during last quarter.

### 16. COMMENTARY ON PROSPECTS

#### Apparel segment

The Board has been more cautious due to global trade tensions and the uncertainty over Everything but Arm ("EBA") trade agreement status between European Union ("EU") and Cambodia.

The China Apparel's sales will be milder than last year but remaining profitable business model and the Cambodia Apparel's sales will be milder if Cambodia lose its EBA status. Nevertheless, the Board still perceives optimism on the near future business outlook.

#### Labelling segment

The Board cautiously believes that this segment will face lacklustre growth in the fiscal year 2020 due to depressed consumer sentiment in Malaysia but optimistic that positive profit-making model shall be able to maintain, while Cambodia's labelling business remains challenging.

#### Others segment

The Board is of the view that the printing and embroidering will record a healthy sales growth in the next quarter.

Management will continue seeking opportunities to capture future growth, unlocking new markets, and focusing on improving operational efficiencies to remain competitive in this challenging environment.

Barring unforeseen circumstances, the management will endeavour to achieve a satisfactory result for the financial year ending 31 March 2020.
